**DETERMINATION OF NON-SIGNIFICANCE (DNS)
City of Langley Shoreline Master Program Periodic Update**

Proponent: City of Langley

Description of the project: City of Langley Shoreline Master Program (SMP) Periodic Review (2021) and update. This is a non-project action and contains proposed policies and regulations to the City's SMP based upon Washington State Department of Ecology Periodic Review SMP guidelines and changes in policy and regulation affecting shoreline management made by the state legislature since 2013 when the SMP was last updated. These changes are outlined in the Washington State Department of Ecology SMP Periodic Update checklist.
