

Ethics Training and Advisory Board Appointment Process

The Board provides ethics orientation and training programs for officials, employees and consultants to the City; provides advisory opinions about the application of the City's code of ethics at the request of officials, employees, or consultants; considers requests for advisory opinions and recommend to the Mayor or City Council as appropriate for final action; and maintain records of all advisory opinions, reviews and recommendations, and prepares an annual report to the City Council on its activities.

This is a volunteer position, appointed by the Mayor. Regular terms of service are three years. Beginning terms will be staggered in length. Candidates must be able to pass a background check. Automatic disqualifiers include:

- 1. Any prior felony convictions.
- 2. Any crime committed that would require someone to register as a sex offender.
- 3. Any crime of moral turpitude.
- 4. Anyone currently under court ordered supervision for any crime.
- 5. Any misdemeanor committed within the previous five years.
- 6. Anyone who is currently the respondent in any domestic violence related court order.
- 7. Anyone who is currently prohibited by federal or state law from possessing a firearm.

Open Positions

The City of Langley currently (November 2016) has two openings for its Ethics Training and Advisory Board. One full board member and one alternate board member. Both candidates must be a resident of the City of Langley.
